



Feminist Theory Archives

The Feminist Theory Archives gathers the work of scholars who have changed the intellectual landscape of universities in the United States and internationally. Established by the Pembroke Center in partnership with the Brown University Library, the collection offers a rare perspective on the rigorous interdisciplinary work that brought feminism to the vanguard of academic research. In the last thirty years, feminist theorists have examined and challenged entrenched patterns of thinking by articulating questions of difference and identity and by exploring the complexities of cultural practice. Just as the Pembroke Center has, over three decades, broadened the definition of feminist work, the scholars represented in this collection have been responsible for profound intellectual changes reaching beyond the sphere of theory and the walls of the academy.

The collection was inaugurated in 2003 with the papers of the late Naomi Schor. It now includes materials from scholars working across a broad array of disciplinary fields, including literature, history, biology, philosophy, and film studies. Unique sets of documents represent each scholar's contributions to feminist theory and, in many cases, to more explicitly political work. The handwritten, typed, and digital materials include research notes, correspondence, syllabi, manuscript drafts, photographs, and programs from landmark conferences and workshops.

The list on the reverse includes the names of scholars who have already contributed collections or expressed their intent to donate their papers. We continue to build the Feminist Theory Archives and extend our gratitude to the many scholars who are participating in the project and to those who will join the list in the future.
